

The Sustainable Energy and Environmental Network Executive Summary of 2016 Activities

The Sustainable Energy & Environmental Network (SEEnet) is a non-profit organization dedicated to community education about environmental stewardship and sustainable use of energy resources and technologies.

Executive Summary Highlights

Highlights for 2016 include the support and the growth of the Delta Engineering Club where students from all Tri-Cities High School are invited to build and race electric derby cars; coordination and support of the 13th annual local Electrathon with nearly 25 derby entries from all over the Pacific Northwest; coordination of Earth Hour and promotion of Mid-Columbia Earth Month events and activities including a kids' contest; and maintaining the Go Green Tri-Cities.org website that features local Green Businesses, a How-To Directory and a 12 month calendar chock full of eco-events.

Delta Engineering Club

The Delta Engineering Club (initially formed at Delta HS) is coordinated by Peter Rieke, a community volunteer and staff scientist at Pacific Northwest National Laboratory. Team members from the regional high schools, with the help of enthusiastic parents, and dedicated mentors, apply their science classroom learning to hands-on, practical engineering tasks.

Our main activity has been building and racing go-cart sized vehicles powered entirely by two automotive batteries. Competitive events are held throughout the Pacific Northwest allowing the team to test their ideas and skills in real make or break events. As the designs are unique and cars are built from scratch, the students are often challenged to find quick fixes for unexpected car problems.

Last year the team raced three cars at three events throughout the Pacific Northwest, rebuilt one go-cart from the ground up and made major modifications to the others. The primary focus last year was on improving the aerodynamic efficiency, reducing weight and driving efficiently.

Six of the team members graduated in 2016 and went on to various universities to study medicine, science and engineering. This loss has put a dent in the experience level of our team, so this year's focus will be on recruiting freshman and sophomores. This year the team will focus on upgrading motor control electronics and instrumenting the cars to monitor performance in real time. 2016 Electrathon at Columbia Basin College

SEEnet, with your help, has, since its inception, sponsored the local Electrathon America race at Columbia Basin College (CBC) and again the Tri-Cities were able to enter two cars in our hometown race. Unlike the previous year the cars all finished with the best car, #965 pictured below, placing in the top third.

25 cars from the Pacific Northwest entered the Pasco Electrathon Race this past April, a well-established event that is considered to be the nucleus of an inland northwest racing circuit. Keeping the CBC race is important to promoting the sport in the inland northwest.



With “project based learning” becoming a focus of high school education, establishing an Electrathon race circuit is a key resource for Inland Northwest high schools and will be instrumental in their decision to start new Electrathon programs. In five years’ time, we hope to establish teams in Ellensburg, Walla Walla, Yakima, Moses Lake as well as Eastern Oregon and Northern Idaho. For that grand vision we will need dedicated sponsors.

Mid-Columbia Earth Month and Earth Hour

Mid-Columbia Earth Month includes the coordination and/or promotion of many activities and events beginning late March (National Earth Hour) through early May, emphasizing Earth Day in April. Through community donations, SEEnet provides support for many of these events. This past year, the Earth Month/Go Green Tri-Cities Committee coordinated a large family Earth Hour event at the REACH museum which included planting native plants, acoustic music, energy efficiency exhibits, sustainable food for purchase, candle making for lights out, star and moon gazing, and a sustainable kids photo contest. About \$500 was awarded to contest winners. This effort included the help of local organizations, businesses, teachers, group leaders and parents.

Other coordinated events include classroom outreach and the publicity of eco-activities held in our community. The Mid-Columbia Earth Month Committee has been a vital tool in the coordination and promotion of environmental activities in the Mid-Columbia.

Go Green Tri-Cities

Go Green Tri-Cities continues to provide environmental education and to promote 'green living' events and activities in our community. Early in 2014, the long-standing Earth Month website merged with Go Green Tri-Cities, which now provides this service year-round. The GGTC website has strived to be the central place for the community to learn about environmental issues and events, find local environmental groups and other

community resources, and provide a wealth of information on how to live in a more eco-friendly way. It also includes the Green Pages directory, a listing of eco-friendly products and services available in this area.

The GGTC committee promotes the website and provides environmental education by tabling at events, and by handing out lists of upcoming Green events in various locations. This year GGTC and the REACH Museum have worked together on several events. This collaboration helps both groups expand their scope of educating the community. In January, GGTC hosted a fair to educate the community about local environmental groups, which was held in the planetarium at CBC, prior to a showing of Earth. It was well attended, and they hope to hold it again this year. A class on composting was planned as part of the Confluent Space garden day, but it was canceled due to weather. GGTC plans to partner with them in the future. GGTC is currently working on a solar energy workshop to be held at Franklin PUD.

GGTC also posts several times a week to their Facebook page. The number of hits it has been receiving, as well as the number of hits on the calendar and other pages on the website, shows that this website and committee are a great community resource. The directory and website are maintained by volunteers, as is all of the work of this committee. The committee members have many ideas for ways to expand environmental education but are limited as a volunteer organization. Funding a part-time position to keep the website current and provide outreach to the community could include establishing Green clubs in high schools and so much more.

As supporters of SEEnet, as well as the Tri-Cities business environment, our sponsors are helping to provide environmental education - maintaining and improving the quality of life we enjoy here.
